The Youth Award is presented to a nominated sophomore, junior or senior year student from each participating area high school. It provides accreditation for community service and volunteer efforts that can be submitted to colleges or potential employers.</p>

The nominated student will receive a Youth Award Certificate, a letter for outstanding achievement, and a United States Congressional Certificate of Achievement.
